#### はじめに

本書は米国 Townsend Press から発行されている外国人向け英語学習教材 VOCAB-ULARY BASICS および GROUNDWORK FOR A BETTER VOCABULARY をベースに、特に日本人大学生・短大生にとって必須の224語を選んで再編集したものである。単に基礎的英単語を機械的に学ぶのではなく、意味・用法・発音を総合的に身につけることを目的とした本書の特徴は以下の3点にある。

- 1) 1つ1つの単語に慣れ親しむための生きた例文。
- 2) 正しい意味と用法を把握するための練習問題。
- 3) 学習効果を再確認し、さらに応用力を高めるためのミニ・エッセイ

全28課で構成されており、巻末には復習問題も用意されているので、毎時間授業で用いる副教材として最適である。さらに、英検・TOEFL向けの語彙対策としてもぜひ活用してもらいたい。

なお本書は、平成9年度杏林大学プロジェクト研究における英語教材開発をきっかけに、学習院大学早坂信教授ならびに成美堂佐野英一郎氏のご助力によって出版されることになった。編集にあたっては、成美堂広江勝己氏、田村栄一氏に大変お世話になった。心から御礼申し上げたい。
