On trips, people usually want to shop or see famous places. They don't normally think about reading or studying. However, there are many fascinating and beautiful libraries around the world. If you visit one, you might want to include more in your travels.

Here are some historical libraries you can visit. In Venice's main square, people are everywhere, so there are few quiet places. However, its library, Biblioteca 10 Marciana, doesn't have many people in it. This library
has wonderful paintings on its walls and ceilings, too. In Dublin, there is a large library called Trinity College Library. Its main room holds over 200,000 books. It also has the Book of Kells-a beautiful copy of the Bible. If you want to see a very old and beautiful library, go to Morocco. Al-Qarawiyyin Library is the oldest in the world located in the city of Fez. Fatima alFihri founded it for the public to study and pray in.

20 Another historical library is in Portugal. Many artists worked together to make the University Library in Coimbra, Biblioteca Joanina, beautiful. This library has a few secrets. First, it has its own jail called the Academic Prison! Students once 25 stayed there if they broke the rules. The second secret is-bats live inside the library. The bats are meant to eat the insects that eat books.

You can also see more modern libraries. There was once a very famous library in Alexandria,
30 Egypt, which was named the Great Library of Alexandria. However, it declined over a number of centuries, and all the knowledge in it was lost. Now, there is a new, modern library called the Bibliotheca Alexandrina. It contains many books,

35 but it also includes museums, art, and a place for studying planets. It honors the old library.

The Vancouver Public Library Central Branch found in Vancouver, Canada is 40 another modern library. The outside of the building looks like the present-day Roman Colosseum. You can find shops, restaurants, and even an 8,000 sq-ft rooftop garden at this public library. There is a free space
45 where people can edit pictures and videos. In addition, this library has appeared in many films and TV shows.
