Another historical library is in Portugal. Many artists worked together to make the University Library in Coimbra, Biblioteca Joanina, beautiful. This library has a few secrets. First, it has its own jail called the Academic Prison! Students once
 stayed there if they broke the rules. The second secret is—bats live inside the library. The bats are meant to eat the insects that eat books.

You can also see more modern libraries. There was once a very famous library in Alexandria,
Egypt, which was named the Great Library of Alexandria. However, it declined over a number of centuries, and all the knowledge in it was lost. Now, there is a new, modern library called the Bibliotheca Alexandrina. It contains many books,

The Vancouver Public Library Central Branch found in Vancouver, Canada is another modern library. The outside of the building looks like the present-day Roman Colosseum. You can find shops, restaurants, and even an 8,000 sq-ft rooftop garden at this public library. There is a free space



⁴⁵ where people can edit pictures and videos. In addition, this library has appeared in many films and TV shows.
