Preface

The World Heritage List is based on the Convention Concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage, which was adopted by the United Nations Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in 1972. The World Heritage List includes more than 1,000 properties forming part of the cultural, natural and mixed heritage which the World Heritage Committee considers as having outstanding universal value.

This textbook is a successor to our former volumes, *Exploring World Heritage on DVD* and *Exploring World Heritage on DVD II*. The video provides students a vivid visual introduction to 15 World Heritage Sites. The textbook activities are designed to improve listening, reading, speaking, and writing skills as well as research and presentation proficiency in English. There are also opportunities for students to increase their awareness of global issues and challenges which each World Heritage property faces. In addition, students can prepare for such examinations as TOEIC and TOEFL by acquiring vocabulary, grammar and comprehension skills. The textbook is written in English except for the introduction and grammatical explanations, so English-speaking teachers will feel comfortable using it.

In conclusion, we hope this textbook will contribute to students' gaining knowledge of world Englishes, cultures, history, and geography as well as taking more interest in Japan UNESCO Association's World Heritage Preservation Campaign (http://www.unesco.jp/).

Content and Usage of This Textbook

- ▲ MINI-QUIZZES Short quizzes about the place or country where the WHS is located
- **PREVIEWING** Various types of vocabulary exercises; Vocabulary words are alphabetically ordered so that students can use it as a mini-dictionary.

VIDEO VIEWING

- **I. First Viewing**: While watching the video, students can fill in the blanks and grasp the overall meaning.
- II. Second Viewing: Students can watch the video again, and check if they can understand every detail of the text.
- **READING** Students can read material concerning the WHS, and deepen their understanding of the site. Before using an electronic dictionary or translation site, first skim through the text to get the overall meaning and answer the questions.
- **CROSS-CULTURAL ACTIVITIES** After listening to a conversation about the WHS in the unit, students can check their comprehension. Then they can use the conversation as a basis for role-play.
- GRAMMAR TIPS Explanation of one grammar item concerning the WHS in each unit
- GRAMMAR QUIZZES Various questions about the grammar item
- writing QUIZZES By answering the quizzes, students will be able to express their own opinions and create opportunities for communication through pair or group activities.
- **WEB RESEARCH** Students will find links to pages about the World Heritage Site discussed in this unit. Please use it for developmental studies such as research and presentation.

Glossary (in the back page): Most of the vocabulary words are listed so that students can prepare or do a review.

The meaning of the Asterisk(s): Vocabulary items are marked for frequency based on *Kenkyusha's Collegiate English-Japanese Dictionary 6th Edition*. The basic 1,000 words usually learned at Japanese junior high school are not marked.

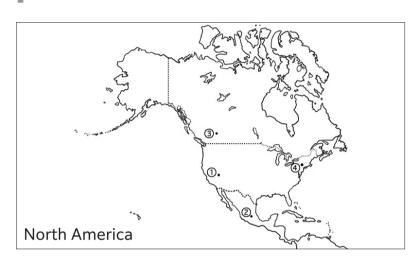

A Welcome to Immigrants

The Statue of Liberty was the first sight to greet the eyes of European immigrants after their long ocean voyage, but nearby Ellis Island was where they first set foot in America. Ellis Island is about 10 minutes by ferry from Liberty Island, the site of the Statue of Liberty. After visiting the Statue of Liberty, many tourists continue on to Ellis Island to learn about the history of immigration in America.

Immigration has been an important feature of American life for hundreds of years. In the 19th century millions of people from all over the world immigrated to America. Near the end of the 19th century the number of immigrants arriving annually greatly increased and it became necessary to set up a new, well-organized system to process them. A new immigration office was opened on Ellis Island in 1892, and over the following years 12 million immigrants entered the United States there.

Newly arrived immigrants were interviewed and given a medical exam before they were admitted to the United States. Some immigrants failed these <u>inspections</u> and had to return to their native countries, but 99% were admitted and left Ellis Island to begin their new lives as Americans. About two-fifths of all Americans can now say that one of their ancestors passed through Ellis Island.

Today, Ellis Island is an important tourist destination for visitors to New York City. The American Museum of Immigration has exhibits that describe the experience of immigrants arriving on the island. There is also a database containing records of immigrant arrivals. Museum visitors can use it to learn more about their own family history in America.
